Participation

Application Process

Completion of an application is required to be considered for class participation. Class size is limited. Participants are selected based on leadership potential and demonstrated community interest. Candidates who are not selected are encouraged to apply again for future classes.

Successful completion of the program requires:

- Attendance required

Attendance is required at the opening retreat, closing retreat, and graduation are mandatory, as is attendance at 7 of the 8 monthly sessions in between.

- Attendance at one community meeting

A report about the experience must be done to complete graduation requirements. Community meetings can take place in Ottumwa, Wapello County, or near-by city or county.

- Completion of group projects

Topics are identified and project groups formed during the first 3 months of the Academy. Groups are expected to work outside of the scheduled monthly sessions on their projects.
